Princeton University's aspiration was to create the most distinguished, collegiate stadium in the United States and to replace the existing Palmer Memorial Stadium, which had deteriorated beyond repair. Princeton required that the stadium be flexible enough to accommodate the broadest range of sports events-football, soccer, lacrosse, and track and field-and to serve as a year-round facility. In the new stadium, the space between the perimeter "wall building" and the gates for spectator seating area was designed so that it could become an attractive place for the university community throughout the year.
