The Tokyo International Forum is a unique civic complex on a 6.7 acre site that accommodates dance, musical and theatrical performances, conventions and trade shows, business meetings, and receptions. Commissioned by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, the Forum is a prime venue for global events and cultural exchange.

Four subway lines and two of the most heavily-used train stations, Tokyo Station and Yurakucho Station, are located to the north and south of the site, generating significant pedestrian traffic in the area. The intent of the design was to create a precinct fully accessible to the public and protected from the impacts of the surroundings.
